What's the magic word?

I am convinced that parents are the biggest influencer in our lives, positively or negatively. In my formative years, I found myself in a single-parent family after a painful divorce. I applaud those required to parent solo on a day-to-day basis. As a parent of three teenagers, my wife and I often comment how we respect and appreciate single parents who face the challenges of raising kids alone. My mom was faithful to the parenting solo task and influenced me with priorities that were ingrained into my being. One of her priorities was to make sure I grew up polite, uttering a "please" or "thank you" whenever it was appropriate. During my childhood, it was a reminder; the reminder became a burden as a teenager; since then it has become a respected principle that I try to own. Back in the day, if I did not show verbal appreciation to my mom, her line came quickly, "What's the magic word?" If "please" did not come out of my mouth, the item was not given.

And gifts would be taken away if a "thank you" did not follow. This was an attempt to instill respect and appreciation. Too often we overlook the utterance of the little word of respect, and we fail to verbalize our heart-felt gratitude. During this season of thankfulness, let's be reminded of the power behind the simple childhood words-please and thank you. We have so much to be thankful for!
